In March, we celebrated the 25th anniversary of the first Vision & Values mailer. The end of this academic year marks 13 years that I have had the honor and pleasure to serve as the Center's executive director.

As you know, we set the standard high and continue to build upon our mission of strengthening the faith and freedom foundation of American citizenship.

We are a strong voice.

Since 2005, we have held 11 annual Ronald Reagan lectures featuring guests such as Michael Reagan, Bill Bennett, Art Laffer, Ed Meese, Peggy Grande, Herb Meyer, and more—over 5,000 people have attended these lectures. We've also held 11 annual conferences on timely topics such as the American family, communism & socialism, faith and freedom, higher education, citizenship and the American cause, the media, and more—over 2,000 guests and students have attended these conferences.

Some exciting changes are on the horizon for the Center.

We are pleased to announce that we have rebranded our American Founders Luncheon Series. Beginning with the December 2018 luncheon, the widely popular event will be titled "Foundations of American Leadership." While we will occasionally still discuss the importance of the brave men and women of the American founding, this transformation will allow us to broaden our discussion topics and highlight many more Americans who have made significant contributions to our nation.

To kick off the new series we look back 20 years to December 1998. Grove City College President Paul J. McNulty '80—who had a front row seat as the Chief Counsel and Director of Communications for the Clinton impeachment proceedings—will give us a firsthand account of what took place two decades ago between Congress and the White House.
